The Circle Unbroken

The Circle Unbroken represents the strength and unity of the Foundation's Staff as we play the role of supportive mentor, youth advocate, and spiritual advisor to our Young Esthers.

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We are a Faith Based Non-Profit Organization with a 501(c)(3) tax exempt status.

The Young Esther Foundation is an outreach program that provides a wholesome and safe environment for at-risk parentless girls ages 7 to 17 years old. The Foundation, originally established in 2004, was organized in response to the growing number of homicides and violence in the immediate surrounding community, and the critical need for these children to have an outlet for anger issues and depression which lead to violent behavior.

The Foundation offers children support with overcoming barriers; provides mentoring and child advocate services. We conduct home and school visits; attend parent days and support sporting events; provide tutorial services to kids in need; provide clothing assistance and school supplies.

The Foundation has a 12-month program, this 12-month program will focus on Self-Esteem, Personal Hygiene and Nutrition. Other programs include; Creative Writing, Computer Training, Economic Development, Community Affairs, Cultural enrichment activities in arts and crafts, praise-worship and dance.

Year round workshops are also offered on anger management, conflict resolution, violence prevention, overcoming barriers, and leadership skills development. Our Selected sport is Tennis.

Education: We provide scholarship assistance; assistance with identifying their educational objectives; assist with improving their reading and writing skills, which will help increase their test scores and each child is required to become involved in our "Reading is fundamental book club".

The Foundation utilizes preventive intervention methodologies to provide a learning environment that allows students to realize that their actions can bring about desired consequences, and that they have a choice in shaping their futures.
